OER offers agencies the ability to provide rich educational materials at no, or low cost and are generously licensed to allow for revision, remixing and redistribution. For learners, OER's can provide additional support, or equivalent learning opportunities, typically at no cost. Additionally, the use of OER can contribute to educational equity, diversity, and inclusion in classrooms. Properly identified OERs can support Anti-Racist teaching practices and give students a sense of belonging while supporting steps toward closing equity gaps.
